

# Tent Peak



## Trip Overview

Tent Peak Climbing is certainly a familiar expedition in the North-East of Nepal. Unquestionably, it is the emphasized combination of both trekking and peak climbing experience in the Himalayan region of Nepal. The Tent Peak belongs in the Annapurna region near Annapurna Base Camp. Therefore, it is the combined climbing with the Base Camp. This popular peak climbing exists at an elevation of 5,663 meters above sea level. Tent Peak, secondly, is famous as TharpuChuli. This peak climbing is part of ABC and altogether, considered to be a dazzling and paradise journey. With this in mind, the region is rich in natural beauty, spectacular adjoining mountains, and incredible landscapes.

The high elevation of the Tent peak falls below 6000 meters. Therefore, it is a suitable opportunity for firsthand experience and preparation for the high expeditions that are above 8,000 meters. Furthermore, this is a chance to understand peak climbing with the ABC Trek. TharpuChuli offers magnificent views of the entire Himalayas of the Annapurna region. To be precise, this region includes sightseeing of Mt Annapurna I (8091 m), Annapurna South (7,219 m), Hiunchuli (6,441 m), Annapurna III (7,555 m) and Singu-Chuli (6501 m) to name few. To conclude, you will be embracing the unparalleled hanging glacier, natural beauty, Himalayan flora, and fauna, and lush forest. The lifestyle of different ethnic groups, traditions, and festivals is intrinsically adorable.

The excursion to the Tent Peak climbing begins from Kathmandu to Pokhara. This short drive takes us to Nayapul. Besides, from here, we start our trek to Annapurna Base Camp following Poon Hill. The trails occasionally take us to the Tadapani and Chhomrong. We spend a day at Annapurna Base Camp and head to the Tent Peak another morning. To summarize, the achievement of conquering is going to become a very unique peak climbing experience. This journey is supported by the green hills, typical local settlements and their customs, high mountains, rivers, streams, and much more.

The best time to plan this climb is from October to November and April to May. The climb is of strenuous plus. It is not physically challenging just like Island peak and Mira Peak.

## **Trip Itinerary**

- Day 1 - Arrival in Kathmandu and transfer to hotel (1400 Mtr/4592 Ft)
- Day 2 - Kathmandu valley sightseeing and preparation of climb.
- Day 3 - Drive from Kathmandu to Nayapul then trek to Thikedunga(1600 Mtr/5248 Ft)
- Day 4 - Trek ascends to Ghorepani (2,800 Mtr/9184 Ft)
- Day 5 - Trek to Tadapani (2630 Mtr/8626 Ft) with Morning hike to Poon hill (3210 Mtr/10530 Ft )
- Day 6 - Trek to Chomrong (2030 Mtr/6658 Ft)
- Day 7 - Trek to Dovan(2500Mtr/8200 Ft)
- Day 8 - Climb to Machhapuchre Base Camp (3700 Mtr/12136 Ft)
- Day 9 - Trek to Annapurna Base Camp (4130 Mtr/13546 Ft)
- Day 10 - Rest and acclimatization day at Base Camp.
- Day 11 - Climb to Tent Peak Base camp(4,250m/13,943ft):
- Day 12 - Climb to High Camp from Tent peak base camp(5,200m/17,056 ft)
- Day 13 - Summit to Tent Camp (TharpuChuli) 5696 Mtr/18684 Ft and fall back to base camp
- Day 14 - Trek to Bamboo (2310m/7575ft)
- Day 15 - Trek to JhinoDanda (1450 Mtr/4756 Ft)
- Day 16 - Trek to Nayapul and drive to Pokhara
- Day 17 - Drive to the Kathmandu valley
- Day 18 - Departure to native destination
